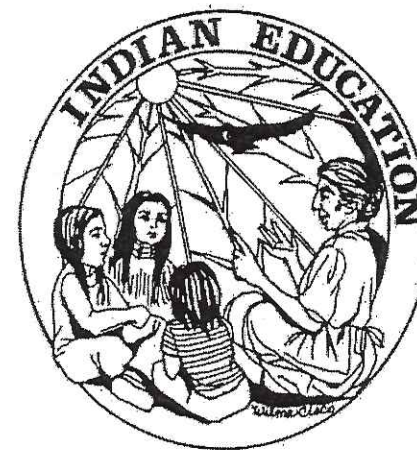

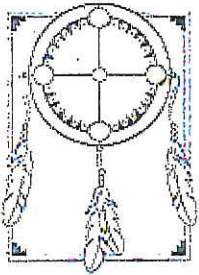
Indian Education Title VII



Program Services

Program Information

Fresno Unified School District Indian Education is a federally funded program that is designed to provide academic and student support services for American Indian and Alaska Native students. The program functions with an active Parent Advisory Committee, which meets every third Tuesday of each month from September through May. Special meetings are held when necessary.



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Title VII-Student Eligibility Certification (ED506) Form

A student Eligibility Certification (ED506) form is required for student enrollment in the FUSD Indian Education Program. The student must be attending a FUSD school. The complete form must be sent to the FUSD Indian Education Program Office.

The Indian Education Act

The Indian Education program has been in the District since 1972. The program operates under the guidelines of the **No Child Left Behind Act (NCLB)** Title VII, Indian, Native Hawaiian, and Alaska Native, Part A, Indian Education, Sub-part I.

Eligibility Information:

In order for a child to be eligible, the parent must provide the following information on the Title VII Student Eligibility Certification forms:

- The name of the child
- The name of the tribe or band or group
- The name of the tribal member
- The address of the tribe or organization
- The date signature of the parent or guardian of child

Services Provided
